Itinerary

Day 1: Arrival in Hanoi – Gateway to the Orient

Day 2: Hanoi City Exploration – Temples, Traditions & The Old Quarter

Day 3: Hanoi to Halong Bay – A Cruise Among Limestone Giants

After breakfast, we depart from Hanoi for a scenic journey through the fertile floodplains of the Red River Delta toward the legendary **Halong Bay**. As a UNESCO World Heritage site and a true natural wonder of the world, the bay's emerald waters and towering limestone karsts offer a breathtaking backdrop for your next adventure. Upon arrival at the harbor, you will be warmly welcomed aboard a **luxurious wooden junk boat**, blending traditional craftsmanship with modern comfort.

As the sails unfurl and we glide past thousands of limestone islets, enjoy a sumptuous **fresh seafood lunch** served on deck. night's sleep.

Day 5: Hue Imperial Tour – Palaces & Pagodas

Today, we step back in time to explore the regal splendor of the Nguyen Dynasty. Our morning begins at the **Imperial City (The Citadel)**, a sprawling complex of palaces, temples, and walls modeled after the Forbidden City in Beijing. As you walk through the majestic Noon Gate, you'll discover the **Thái Hòa Palace** and the evocative ruins of the Purple Forbidden City, which still whisper stories of royal intrigue and grandeur.

Later, we board a traditional **private "Dragon Boat"** for a serene cruise down the **Perfume River**. Our destination is the iconic **Thien Mu Pagoda**, an elegant seven-story tower that has stood as a symbol of Hue for centuries. Your lunch today features **Royal Hue Cuisine**, known for its artistic presentation and small, delicate portions—originally designed to please the aesthetic tastes of emperors—so be sure to have your camera ready before you take your first bite! Finally, if you're interested in photography, the late afternoon light at the **Khai Dinh Tomb** creates stunning shadows against its dark stone exterior and brilliant interior mosaics, offering some of the most dramatic photo opportunities in Central Vietnam.*

Day 6: Hue to Hoi An – Over the Majestic Hai Van Pass

Today's journey south is one of the most scenic drives in all of Southeast Asia. We traverse the legendary **Hai Van Pass**, or "Ocean Cloud Pass," where the road winds through lush mountains offering spectacular panoramic views of the sparkling coastline and the sapphire waters of the East Vietnam Sea. After descending, we make a stop at the **Marble Mountains**, a cluster of five limestone and marble hills filled with hidden caves, ancient Buddhist sanctuaries, and sweeping viewpoints.

By afternoon, we arrive in the enchanting town of **Hoi An**, a remarkably well-preserved UNESCO World Heritage site. Hoi An is also the **tailoring capital of the world**; if you are interested in having a custom-made suit or dress, we recommend visiting a tailor on your very first evening to allow enough time for fittings and final adjustments before you depart.

Day 7: Hoi An Free Day – Tailors, Lanterns & Beaches

Today is yours to embrace the slow and soulful pace of **Hoi An** at your leisure. This charming town offers a wealth of experiences tailored to every interest. You might choose to visit one of the legendary **local tailors** to have a bespoke silk suit or dress custom-made in as little as 24 hours. For food enthusiasts, joining a **Vietnamese Cooking Class** is a fantastic way to uncover the secrets of "Pho" and "Spring Rolls," often beginning with a vibrant market tour to select fresh, local ingredients.

If you crave nature, a gentle **bicycle ride** through emerald rice paddies will lead you to the golden sands of **An Bang Beach** for a relaxing dip in the sea. Alternatively, you can take a peaceful boat trip to a nearby **ceramic village** to watch artisans at work, or simply find a quiet spot in a riverside cafe to savor a cup of traditional **Salt Coffee**, watching the colorful wooden boats drift slowly down the Thu Bon River.

Expert Tips for Your Free Day in Hoi An:

If you are interested in the **bespoke tailoring** service, this morning is your final window to start an order to ensure at least two fittings for a perfect result. When cycling to the beach, keep a few small bills in **Vietnamese Dong** handy for the nominal bicycle parking fees charged by local vendors. Finally, as evening falls, don't miss the chance to take a **small sampan boat** on the river to release a floating paper lantern—it is a beautiful local tradition believed to bring good luck and peace.

Day 8: Hoi An to Ho Chi Minh City – From Ancient to Modern

After a final breakfast in the tranquil surroundings of Hoi An, we transfer to the airport for a short flight to **Ho Chi Minh City**, still affectionately known by many as **Saigon**. Upon arrival, you will instantly feel the pulse of Vietnam's most dynamic metropolis, where sleek skyscrapers stand in harmony with French colonial landmarks and bustling traditional markets.

Our exploration begins at the **War Remnants Museum**, offering a poignant and deeply moving look at the nation's resilient history. When exploring the **Ben Thanh Market**, remember that prices for tourists are often set higher, so feel free to engage in some **friendly bargaining**—it's a completely expected part of the local shopping culture. For your evening in District 1, you are in the culinary heart of the country; we suggest visiting a **rooftop bar** near Dong Khoi Street for a cocktail at sunset. Seeing the "city of motorbikes" light up from above is the best way to appreciate the sheer scale and energy of modern Saigon.*

Day 9: Mekong Delta Adventure – The Rice Basket of Vietnam

Today, we escape the urban hum of Saigon for the lush, labyrinthine waterways of the **Mekong Delta**. Our journey takes us to **Ben Tre**, a picturesque province celebrated as the "Land of Coconuts." We board a private boat to cruise along the vast **Tien River**, watching the vibrant river life unfold as local barges and fishing boats drift past.

The true magic begins as we switch to a **small traditional sampan**, hand-rowed through narrow, palm-shaded canals where the canopy of water coconuts creates a cool, emerald tunnel. Along the way, we visit humble **local workshops** to witness the craft of coconut candy making and stroll through fragrant **fruit orchards** to enjoy honey tea and seasonal tropical fruits. For lunch, you will savor a true Delta delicacy: **Elephant Ear Fish**, served standing upright and rolled into fresh spring rolls—a culinary highlight that perfectly captures the authentic rhythm of life in Vietnam's "Rice Basket."

Expert Tips for Your Mekong Delta Trip:

*The Mekong Delta is known for its tropical humidity and sun, so a **high-SPF sunscreen** and a wide-brimmed hat are essential for your boat excursions. We also recommend applying **mosquito repellent** before heading into the narrow canals and orchards to ensure your comfort. While the sampan ride is very stable, you'll be stepping on and off small wooden boats throughout the day, so **non-slip sandals or sturdy shoes** are much better than flip-flops. If you find a local handicraft you love in the workshops, such as coconut-shell carvings, this is a great place to buy directly from the artisans, supporting the local community while bringing home a unique piece of the Delta.*

Day 10: Saigon to Siem Reap – Into the Heart of the Khmer Empire

After a final morning in Saigon, we transfer to the airport for a short flight across the border to **Siem Reap**, the gateway to the archaeological wonders of Cambodia. You have now arrived in the heart of the ancient **Khmer Empire**, a place where spiritual grandeur and jungle-clad mysteries await. Upon arrival, you will be transferred to your luxury heritage hotel to settle in and

soak up the unique atmosphere of this colonial-influenced town.

To prepare you for the wonders ahead, we begin with a visit to the **Angkor National Museum**. This world-class institution houses a stunning collection of Khmer artifacts, helping you decode the complex history, religion, and artistry of the "Golden Age." Our day concludes with a grand **welcome dinner** accompanied by a breathtaking **Apsara Dance Performance**. Expert Tips for Your Arrival in Cambodia:

*As you enter your second country of the odyssey, please have your **passport-sized photos** and crisp **US Dollar bills** ready for the Visa-on-Arrival process at Siem Reap International Airport—this will ensure a much faster transition through immigration. Cambodia is a **dual-currency economy**; while the local Riel is used for small change, the US Dollar is the primary currency used in shops and restaurants, so there is no need to exchange large amounts of money. For the **Apsara Performance**, the venue can sometimes be quite cool due to air conditioning, so bringing a light shawl or pashmina is a good idea. Finally, try to get a restful night's sleep tonight, as tomorrow involves an early start for one of the most iconic experiences in world travel: the sunrise at Angkor Wat.*

Day 11: Angkor Wat Deep Dive – Sunrise to Sunset

Today begins before dawn for a truly bucket-list experience: witnessing the **Sunrise at Angkor Wat**. As the first light of day silhouettes the iconic lotus-like towers against a changing sky, you will see why this is considered the pinnacle of Khmer architecture. After the sun rises, we dive deep into the world's largest religious monument, exploring its endless galleries of **intricate bas-reliefs** that depict celestial dancers and epic battles from Hindu mythology.

Our journey continues to the ancient walled capital of **Angkor Thom**, the "Great City." At its heart lies the **Bayon Temple**, famous for the hundreds of enigmatic, serene stone faces that gaze down from its towers. We conclude this extraordinary day at **Ta Prohm**, famously known as the "Jungle Temple." Left largely to the whims of nature, it features giant **silk-cotton tree roots** that embrace and reclaim the ancient stone walls, creating a hauntingly beautiful scene where the power of the jungle and the ruins of man are inextricably entwined.

Expert Tips for Your Angkor Adventure:

*The "Angkor Pass" is a sacred document here, so keep it in a **waterproof lanyard or pouch** as it will be checked at every temple entrance. Because Angkor is an active religious site, a **strict dress code** applies: both men and women must cover their shoulders and knees (a simple scarf over the shoulders is often not accepted by temple guards, so a T-shirt or sleeved shirt is best). To beat the midday heat and the largest crowds, your guide will likely suggest a **"split schedule"**—exploring early in the morning, returning to the hotel for a refreshing midday swim, and heading back out in the late afternoon when the light is softer for photography. Finally, stay hydrated; the jungle humidity can be intense, so carry an **insulated water bottle** and don't forget to reapply sunscreen frequently.*

Day 12: Tonle Sap Lake – Flight to Spiritual Luang Prabang

This morning, we explore the rhythmic water world of **Tonle Sap**, the largest freshwater lake in Southeast Asia. We board a private boat to visit a fascinating **floating village**, where the ingenuity of the Khmer people is on full display. You will see an entire community—complete with schools, markets, and even police stations—perched on towering stilts or floating on the water, adapting to the lake's seasonal rise and fall.

In the afternoon, we bid farewell to Cambodia and take a short flight to **Luang Prabang**, Laos. This UNESCO-protected town is the undisputed spiritual heart of the country, a place where time seems to stand still. Nestled at the confluence of the Mekong and Nam Khan rivers, Luang Prabang greets you with a landscape of golden-roofed temples, French-colonial villas, and the sight of saffron-robed monks moving quietly through the streets.

Expert Tips for Your Arrival in Luang Prabang:

*Upon arrival at Luang Prabang International Airport, your **Laos Visa-on-Arrival** will require a fee in US Dollars (usually between \$30-\$45 depending on nationality); ensure your bills are perfectly crisp and issued after 2006 to avoid any issues. Luang Prabang is famously relaxed, and you will notice a significant drop in pace compared to Saigon or Siem Reap. To respect the local "**Sabai Sabai**" (relaxed) culture, we suggest keeping your voice low in public areas and always asking permission before taking photos of the monks. For your first evening, a stroll through the **Luang Prabang Night Market** is a must—it is one of the most peaceful markets in Asia, specializing in exquisite hand-woven textiles and Hmong handicrafts at very fair prices.*

Day 13: Luang Prabang – Sacred Rituals & Turquoise Waterfalls

Your day begins in the quiet light of dawn with the **Tak Bat (Alms Giving Ceremony)**. This deeply moving Buddhist tradition, where hundreds of saffron-robed monks walk silently through the streets to receive offerings, is a profound display of faith and community. Afterward, we visit the glittering **Wat Xieng Thong**, the "Temple of the Golden City." With its sweeping roofs that touch the ground and intricate "Tree of Life" mosaics, it remains the finest jewel of Lao temple architecture.

In the afternoon, we drive through the scenic countryside to the stunning **Kuang Si Waterfalls**. This multi-tiered wonder features cascading water that settles into crystal-clear, **turquoise pools** surrounded by lush jungle. You can take a refreshing dip in the cool waters or hike to the top for a panoramic view. Before leaving, we stop at the nearby **Sun Bear Sanctuary**, a dedicated center that rescues and rehabilitates these endangered animals from the illegal wildlife trade, offering a heart-warming look at local conservation efforts.

Expert Tips for Your Day in Luang Prabang:

*To participate in or observe the **Tak Bat** respectfully, please maintain a quiet distance and avoid using a camera flash, which can be very disruptive to the monks' meditation in motion; if you wish to offer alms, your guide will help you prepare the traditional sticky rice and show you the proper*

kneeling etiquette. For the **Kuang Si Waterfalls**, we recommend wearing your **swimsuit under your clothes** or bringing a sarong, as the public changing facilities are basic. The jungle paths around the falls can be slippery, so **sturdy walking sandals** with good grip are much safer than flip-flops. Lastly, your **Lao Picnic** by the falls is a wonderful time to try "Jeow Bong" (a local spicy chili paste)—it pairs perfectly with sticky rice and the cool, misty atmosphere of the forest.

Day 14: Luang Prabang Departure – Farewell Indochina

On your final morning in Laos, enjoy a leisurely breakfast overlooking the timeless **Mekong River**, reflecting on the incredible journey you've shared across Vietnam, Cambodia, and Laos. To complete your cultural immersion, we visit the **Royal Palace Museum**. Originally built as the residence for King Sisavang Vong, this elegant site blends French Beaux-Arts style with traditional Lao design and now houses the precious **Phra Bang** Buddha statue, the town's namesake and most sacred relic.

Depending on your flight schedule, you may have some final moments to pick up a last-minute souvenir or enjoy one more Lao coffee by the river. Your **private driver** will then transfer you to the airport for your departure flight. As you board, you take with you the vibrant colors, sacred traditions, and warm smiles of the region—marking the end of your unforgettable **Indochina Odyssey**.

Expert Tips for Your Departure:

*To ensure a stress-free departure, please have your passport and flight itinerary ready for the airport check-in; our driver will aim to have you at the airport approximately **two hours before your international flight**. If you have any remaining **Lao Kip**, we recommend spending it or exchanging it before you leave the country, as it can be difficult to convert once you are outside of Laos. For those with a late afternoon flight, we suggest a final visit to a local bakery for some **French-influenced pastries**—a delicious reminder of the region's colonial history.
